Chances were starting to come Town's way with one in particular falling to Dan Saunders inside the six yard box which somehow he managed to stab wide of the post. Caldicot were dominating this part of the game and after forcing several freekicks and corners, Caldicot would equalise through centre half Matt James. A well delivered corner from David Lloyd saw MJ challenge and power a header into the Celtic net after the home keeper had misjudged the flight of the ball.

Getting to the Ground:

Distance from Caldicot to Station Road is 34 miles and will take you 41 minutes without traffic.

Leave the M4 at Junction 33, and take the A4232 (signposted for Cardiff West and the Airport). Follow this road for about two miles and leave at the Culverhouse Cross junction (again signposted for the Airport). At the roundabout, take the third exit onto the A4050. Go over three roundabouts, and turn left into Station Road just before you get to a grey footbridge over the road (the turning is marked for Wrinstone, and there's a nice new brown road sign saying "Ely Rangers" about 300 yards before the turning!). Follow the road, and the entrance to the ground is through the second gateway on the right.

Where can I get beer and food:

Ely Rangers have a bar and refreshment outlet selling tea, coffee and snacks. Last season the entry to the ground was £5 but this included a free pint! I found the club to be very welcoming.

Welsh League Division Two - 25 Oct 2014: Cwmbran Celtic 1 - 1 Caldicot Town

Report from Mark Anderson

Missing 5 players from the squad, Mark Williams was still able to field a competitive side to face Cwmbran Celtic. This was going to be Celtic's first competitive league fixture having only been able to play cup games due to the on-going fight in maintaining their first division status. Knowing that they would be chomping at the bit and eager to get off to winning ways you could have well expected Caldicot to suffer but instead they grew into the game and should have in all honesty taken the 3 points on offer. Starting up front for Caldicot were Dan Saunders, fresh from scoring the winner against Haverfordwest in the league cup, and Richard Sharratt who hoped to add to his tally of scoring 6 goals so far this season. Celtic started brightly as you would well expect with the majority of their play coming down the right hand side. Dean Palmer took a knock and struggled on before having to make way for youngster Tyler Morgan-Huggett who slotted into the right back berth meaning Simon Crook moved to the left back position.

Both sides had settled by now and Celtic were forcing the play with a number of corners which Caldicot dealt with but neither side really had the chances that would force either keeper into action. At the end of the half both sides looked fairly solid at the back with chances at a premium although you felt like things would soon open up. As the game went on Celtic eventually broke the deadlock through former Caldicot favourite Dominic Connor. Tata Steel – Club History*

With the building of the biggest Steel Works in Europe, the club became known as Margam Steel AFC in the 40's and played in the local Port Talbot League. When the works was commissioned in the 50's Margam Steel became S.C.O.W. AFC. After two seasons in the Port Talbot league Steel Company of Wales AFC made a brief excursion into the South Wales Amateur League in Season 1952-53 lasting just one season , finishing in fifth place , before dropping back into the local league. After 12 years in the local league with some limited success, S.C.O.W. AFC once again entered the Amateur League, with the first 12 years seeing the club promoted 4 times, winning the 2nd Division Championship in 1978/79 , they held their division 1 status for 4 years before relegation .Within this period S.C.O.W. AFC fell in line with the local steelworks and became known as British Steel AFC. In 1988 and entered one of the most successful periods of the clubs history. British Steel AFC became Corus Steel FC in 1999 .In season 1985/86 they once again won the 2nd Division South Wales Amateur League Championship to enter the 1st Division where they remained for 23 years. Under Coaches Wayne Davies and Wayne Edwards British Steel won their first Division 1 title in 1988 and retained the title in 1989. During this period Steel won a number of trophies and reached the Corinthian Cup Final 5 times between 1989 and 1994. Then in 1994 Steel won the league again , this time managed by Bobby Howe and continued to be successful for many years but could not win the league again before clinching the 2008/09 1st Division Championship which has seen them enter the Welsh League Third Division with Steve Lewis and Paul Evans at the helm. After consolidating their position in Welsh League Division 3 in 2009/10 Steel gained their second promotion in 3 seasons when finishing runner up to Monmouth Town last season. Promotion again in 2010/11 season saw reality exceed our wildest dreams to play in Division Two and last season saw us promoted for the third time in four seasons, finishing once again runners up to Monmouth Town. Season 2012-13 saw us keep the vast majority of the squad and with a few additions and we retained our position in Division One at the end of the season. However Tata Steel were relegated from Division 1 in season 2013-14.
