CLUB HISTORY

“Football for everyone”

C

aldicot Town AFC was founded in 1953. With voluntary help from the community, the necessary funds were raised, and after much hard work, two pitches were laid at King

George V playing fields. Initially a green wooden hut was erected to serve as changing rooms with a small shower area.

The club participated in the East Gwent League before forming a second team in 1963, taking their place in the East Gwent 2nd Division.

Throughout the 60's the club was successful in winning both the East Gwent league division 1 and 2 along with cup success in the Watkins Shield, the Benevolent Cup, Gill Cup and the Argus Shield. In 1966 the senior side joined the Monmouthshire Senior League Division, now known as the Gwent County League.

During the late 70's and early 80's the club won the Gwent Senior League Division 1, on two occasions, as well as winning the Senior Cup (more recently in 2007/08 & 2012/13 seasons) and Amateur Cup. In December 1975, the original Clubhouse was built in Jubilee Way.

This incorporated a small bar, a lounge, changing rooms and shower facilities. Since then, the clubhouse has been modified and upgraded and now boasts four players changing rooms, a referee's room, shower and toilet facilities, a large function room, a new lounge, and outside patio areas complete with bench seats.

1979 saw the formation of Caldicot Town Junior Section. This gave local boys the opportunity to play competitive football at both Local and County Level. It is also a source of future players for the senior teams. In 1986 the club achieved its ambition of election into the Welsh Football League. A lot of hard work by many people had to be done to achieve this goal. The ground had to be enclosed with a high perimeter fence and a barrier had to be put up around the pitch. Also, the changing facilities had to reach the high standards set by the League.

In the early 90's, continuous ground improvements saw a floodlights erected as well as a covered stand. In more recent times, the club has added seats to its original stand before adding a brand-new stand in 2017 to bring the Jubilee Way ground up to the required 250 covered seating criteria.

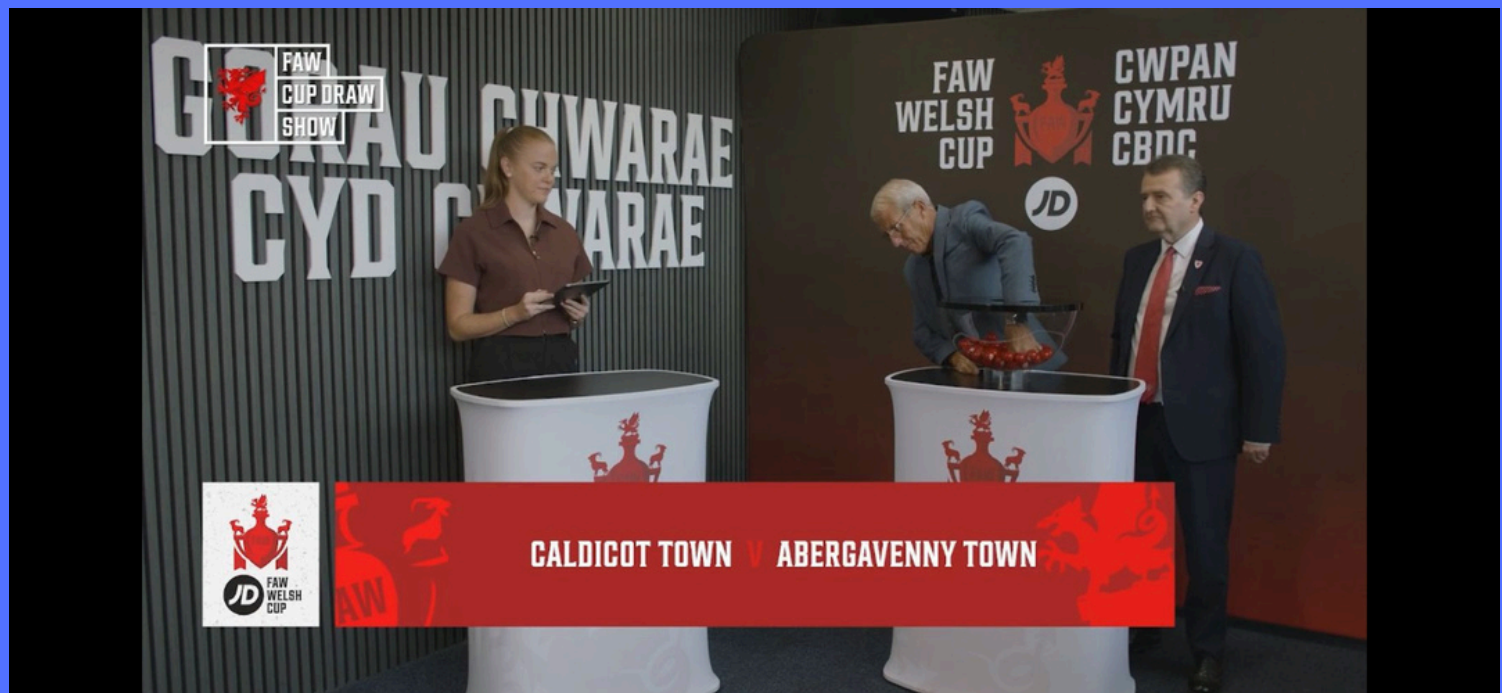
Since season 2020/21, Caldicot found themselves in a brand-new pyramid system run by the FAW. Caldicot sat in Tier 3 which will be known as the "Ardal Southern league East". The Reserves team will play within this structure whilst the Third Team will maintain its place in the East Gwent division.

Caldicot is a community club where inclusion and diversity are key principles. Apart from Senior Men's, Youth and Junior teams, Caldicot also have a successful Ladies team that have grown from strength to strength in the past few years and will be competing in the Welsh Women League.

TODAY'S OPPONENTS

Tredegear Town AFC was formed over 40 years ago in 1968 by its present life president Cliff Bethel to provide a recreation for those young men who preferred playing association football to Rugby Union, the team was originally known as the Rhyd Boys Club and was known throughout Wales for sending players to represent Wales at school boy and Boys Club of Wales level.

In 1983 the team changed to Tredegear Town AFC and moved on to senior level football initially plying their trade in the North Gwent Division One League rising to a Premier Division place in the 1980s.

TREDEGAR TOWN

With the introduction of the Welsh League Pyramid of non-league clubs Tredegear gained a place in the Gwent County FA League and played their games at the Recreation Ground. The team rose from Division 3 to Division 2 then to the top division, then in season 1997-98 they won the Gwent County League and applied to the Welsh League for membership and joined the Welsh football league in season 1998-99.

After one season they finished runners up in the league and gained promotion to Welsh Football League Division Two in 2000-01 and remained in this division until they were relegated at the end of the 2009-10 season.

GROUND REGULATIONS

These regulations are stipulated in the interest of fair play and safety for all.

1

Spectators must not consume alcoholic drinks or drinks from glasses or bottles whilst on the football ground at ANY TIME. This is a FIFA rule and must be enforced.

Spectators can drink on the patio area but only from a plastic glass, available on request from the bar.

2

Spectators must not trespass on the playing field or adjoining areas; climb on any buildings, walls or fencing, nor interfere or climb on the floodlights.

3

Spectators must not use obscene, racist, offensive or discriminatory language or gestures, including spitting on or at any person.

4

Spectators must not throw any objects within the ground. This is a criminal offence and strong action will be taken.

5

Spectators must not bring personal footballs, handheld megaphones or alike into the ground.

6

Spectators must comply with instructions given by club officials.

7

Spectators must keep dogs on leads at all times.

8

Spectators must retain control of and be responsible for any minors at the game.

9

Spectators must pay an entrance fee when appropriate.

Caldicot Town will not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to any property, person or persons (including children) on the ground, in the changing rooms or clubhouse. Caldicot Town is not responsible for loss or damage to articles left on the premises. Please note more detailed ground regulations are posted around the ground and changing rooms.

The FAW Fair Play Code aims to raise the profile of the Fair Play message by inspiring players, clubs, officials, and supporters to maintain good on-field discipline including abiding by the Laws of the Game, respecting opponents, referees and promoting the interests of football.

To encourage good behaviour, the FAW will periodically publish Disciplinary Tables for each of the Directly Affiliated Leagues via a dedicated page on the FAW website. Those topping each table at the end of the season are awarded a Fair Play Award and a prize of £1000 to be spent on improving facilities at your club.

Previous winners of the Award have invested the money on an upgrade to dressing rooms, new equipment such as balls, bibs, kit and improving the pitch. The FAW Off the Pitch campaign is also represented here today and aims to educate all our stakeholders including clubs and players with regards best practice when using social media.

Off the Pitch is also here to remind stakeholders how comments made via social media can reflect on their club or competition that they participate in and therefore, offers advice to players and club officials such as treating others with respect. Be in the right state of mind when posting and to generally act responsibly when using all forms of social media.

The Off the Pitch campaign is unique amongst National Associations within Europe and has been used as evidence of best practice with regards promoting the positive usage of social media by UEFA.

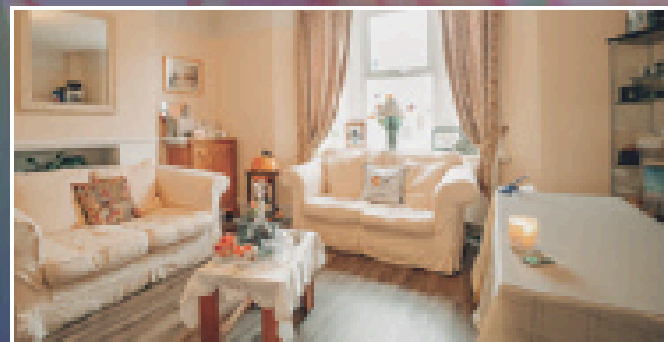
